## WHEN SHELTER IN PLACE RESTRICTIONS BEGIN TO RELAX HERE ARE A FEW GUIDLINES FROM AMADOR COUNTY HEALTH REGARDING DINING OUT

Do not Dine-Out if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms such as: Cough, difficulty breathing, shortness of breath or fever. Maintain social distancing. When you enter wash your hands with soap & water or use sanitizer. Check with restaurant staff for proper social distancing seating arrangements. *Protect yourself & others while you dine.*

**REMINDER:** It's that time of year to clear weeds & brush from around your property to reduce flammable vegetation. Keep a 30 foot perimeter around your home for fire safety. Weed eat in the morning hours when temperatures are cooler to avoid heat exhaustion and stay hydrated while working outside.
