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STATUS ON FIRE STATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT



A proposal to begin the environmental work is going to the City Council for approval on October 12. If approved, it should take approximately 2 months and then, after a pre-bid conference for bidders, the project will go out to bid for construction. Once bids are received, the Council will select a contractor and construction will begin. Once construction is started it should only take about 45 working days to complete.

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Here are a few tips to help you prepare for Power outages

- Cell phones might not work properly in emergency situations. If you have a land line (assuming it is not internet or wireless), it will generally work during a power outage.
- Check your lanterns for batteries and find your candles as light sources
- Buy ice and ice chests to keep food cold * Cook meat ahead of time & put in ice chests
- Service your generator and make sure it is full of gas. Check that you have a gas can full of gas
- Heavy duty extension cords are needed for generators
- Have enough bottled water to last a few days * Freeze large containers of water to put in the refrigerator
- Withdraw cash because ATM's won't work and banks might not be open
- Gas up cars and gas cans * Check propane level on BBQ before shut off
- Stock up on blankets and sleeping bags
- Make a master call list of family, friends and neighbors in & out of town to check in on
- Coordinate with neighbors that have generators
- Water heaters _have gallons of stored water that can be used. Search in www.wikihow.com for more details.

Will my water work when the power goes out?

AWA has a backup generator for emergencies, so your water should not be affected.

When will my power be turned on?

The City of Plymouth gets the same information that goes out to the general public. When we get updates we will send out a CodeRED message to keep you informed if you are signed up.

Harvest Fest 2023 Chili Cook-Off Rules and Entry

Entry forms due to City Hall or by email by 10/16/23 Entry Fee: \$25

Participants **must** prepare at least 3 gallons or more of chili to share with the public/judges.

Chili can be prepared on site or brought on site but must be prepared in a commercial environment. All participants are required to sign a City of Plymouth release of liability form.

Participants must provide a propane stove/burner or electric kettle and with generator to keep chili at or above 140 degrees. Chili that is being reheated on site must reach a temperature of at least 165 for 15-30 seconds then held above 140. The temperature requirements must be met prior to the start of the event at 2pm. Chili temperatures will be monitored by the committee.

Participants will serve 2-3 oz servings of their chili to paid participants until which time the chili runs out or 5pm which ever occurs first. Prizes will be awarded shortly after 5pm.

Winners will be determined by the number of ballots cast by paid participants.

Three prizes will be given
Champion Chili with beans - Trophy
Champion Chili with out beans - Trophy
Best booth decoration - \$50

Cook-off Organizers will provide the following for each entry. 1- 8 ft table, 3 oz sample cups, spoons, napkins. Pop up tents are required for each booth. The organizers have a limited number of pop-up tents available on a first requested first served basis. Please let us know if you need at pop up
