Minimum Qualifications & How to Apply:

- Must be a resident of Amador County.
- Must be 18 years old with a valid Driver's License.
- No training or experience is necessary to apply!
- The District provides all training at no cost to you.
- Training is a couple of hours one evening a week at your local fire station.
- Simply contact us at (209) 223-6391 and we will take it from there!

FAQs about volunteering for the Amador Fire Protection District:

How often would I have to respond to emergencies? The district responds to approximately 3,500 calls for service annually, with the majority of those being medical-related emergencies.

Do I have to respond to every call? No, as a volunteer we ask that you respond if and when you are available.

What is the time commitment? Outside of emergency response, the time commitment consists of weekly training drills. Weekly drills typically start at 6:30 pm and last approximately 2 hours.

Training drills take place at your closest staffed Amador Fire station.

We understand that work and other things come up and may preclude you from attending trainings from time to time, that is ok, we will work with your schedule.

Will volunteering help me with a career in the fire service?

Yes, many career firefighters begin their careers as volunteer firefighters and Amador Fire has a very proud history of helping many career firefighters get their start.

Even if you are not interested in a career, serving as a volunteer firefighter is a very fulfilling experience!
