March should be full of fun as we head into Springtime. Unfortunately, due to all the rain we are getting, Makers Market is cancelled on March 9th, but look for them to return on April 13th.

Highlights of the February Council meetings include the following:

- Approved minutes for two previous meetings
- Received and filed the Annual and Five Year Development Impact Fee Report for /fiscal Year ended June 30, 2023
- Adopted an Ordinance increasing the City Manager's spending authority to \$20,000
- Awarded a TOT Grant to Four Fires Food and Wine Festival event
- Approved a contract amendment with Shenandoah Construction Company for work at the Waste Water Treatment Plant
- Approved taking over pool operations this year
- Gave direction on the Ione Band of Miwok Indian Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration to meet and confer with the Tribe

We have reformatted the policies that previous City Councils have adopted and given them new numbers and put them on-line as well. We added this last month with the thought that it would be helpful for the public to be able to see the policies that the City Council has adopted over the past two years which they are holding themselves and each other accountable.

We are planning a movie in the park night. We are working on all of the logistics, so keep your eyes out for more information to come.

On April 13th we are planning a family event in McGee Park in conjunction with Makers Market. There will be games for the whole family, and we are working on some other fun exciting things that we hope families will enjoy. More information will be in the April newsletter.
